## Notice of Open Special Public Meeting

Public notice is hereby given that a special public hearing with the Board of Trustees of the Village of Leawood, MO will be held at 7:30 P.M. on August 17, 2010 on the proposed hazard mitigation plan.

The Harry S. Truman Coordinating Council Area Hazard Mitigation Committee has coordinated preparing A Hazard Mitigation Plan (as required by FEMA and SEMA) for various public entities, including villages like Leawood. This plan addresses mitigation of hazards like tornados, flooding and severe weather conditions. The plan includes eight specific action plans to mitigate hazard conditions.

The meeting will be conducted at the Redings Mill Fire Station, 5202 S. Rangeline.

## Trash Removal – Very Important Notice

As noted in the July Ledger, at the July 20<sup>th</sup> meeting the Board of Trustees reviewed the three competitive bids for trash hauling services. As a result a five year agreement was awarded to Allied Waste Services (AW), who also provides services to Joplin, Carthage, and Carl Junction. Key elements of the agreement include:

1. A quarterly rate of \$30.00 (fixed for first three years) compared to our current \$34.50 with WCA. Thereafter rates can be increased by a minimum of 3% to a maximum of 5%, based on specific indexes.
2. Each customer will receive a 95-gallon poly-cart to place their household waste. Only trash in the cart will be picked-up. Additional carts at a quarterly cost of \$15.00 are available.
3. AW will collect one large household item (no white goods) per week on the regular scheduled pick-up day, upon notifying AW at 800-431-1507.
4. AW has been provided a listing of existing customers of WCA.
5. The last scheduled pick-up by WCA will be Thursday, August 29<sup>th</sup>.
6. Poly-carts will be delivered to existing customers in the next two weeks.
7. AW has not confirmed their pick-up day, but it appears to be Tuesday. AW will send a notice to residents.

## Trimming Tree Limbs

Residents are required to maintain a minimum of 20 feet clearance of their tree limbs that are over the streets. This provides adequate clearance for vehicles, including motor homes. A similar request was made a few years ago and residents responded positively and therefore, no further action was required by the Board of Trustees.
